There are numerous stress fractures about the foot and ankle of which a trauma and orthopaedic surgeon should be aware. These include: metatarsal, tibia, calcaneus, navicular, fibula, talus, medial malleolus, sesamoid, cuneiform and cuboid.

Signs and symptoms of a broken toe include: Pain, swelling, bruising, or stiffness following the injury. Difficulty walking due to the pain (especially with a broken big toe) A broken little toe (pinkie toe) may be painful, but usually does not limit the ability to walk.

A fracture is a break in your bone or the surrounding cartilage, and the severity of a foot fracture can range from what is called a "hairline" or "stress" fracture to a full break across the foot. A foot fracture will cause significant discomfort, especially because the foot is a weight-bearing bone. Fractures of the feet are most common in runners, basketball players, football

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players, or anyone who exerts much force and strain on the feet.

~~Toe and Metatarsal Fractures (Broken Toes)~~ The structure of the foot is complex, consisting of bones, muscles, tendons and other soft tissues. Of the 28 bones in the foot, 19 are toe bones (phalanges) and metatarsal bones (the long bones in the midfoot). Fractures of the toe and metatarsal bones are common and require evaluation by a specialist.

Certain parts of the foot are more likely to develop stress fractures than others. Areas that typically have these fractures are: the metatarsals, the navicular bone, the calcaneus, tibia, and fibula. Since women are at an increased risk of developing osteoporosis, they are twice as likely as men to sustain a stress fracture.

Fractures of the foot include toe fractures and fractures of the middle bones of the foot (metatarsal fractures), the two small round bones at the base of the big toe (sesamoid fractures), or the bones at the back of the foot, including fractures of the heel bone (calcaneus).

A broken foot is an injury to the bone. You may experience a broken foot during a car crash or from a simple misstep or fall. The seriousness of a broken foot varies. Fractures can range from tiny cracks in your bones to breaks that pierce your skin.

There are 26 bones in the foot. These bones support our weight and allow us to walk and run. Certain activities or injuries can cause a fracture, or break, in one or more of these bones. Pain, swelling, redness and even bruising are signs of a possible fracture.

A tibia/fibula (tib/fib) fracture is a common fracture of the ankle bones. The tibia (shin bone) and fibula (bone on the outside part of your ankle) are located in the lower leg and help form part of your ankle joint. Occasionally, just one of the bones, either the tibia or fibula, is broken.

Falls on to the feet or violent dorsiflexion of the ankle (eg, against car pedals in a car accident) may cause fractures to the anterior body or articular dome of the talus. Talar fracture is the second most common fracture of the tarsal bones. Talar injuries are not easily diagnosed and can create significant long-term disability when missed.

A stress fracture of the foot is a bone crack that may occur as a result of repetitive low-impact force. 1 Stress fractures are not typically sudden events, and they can begin as tiny cracks in the bone that gradually enlarge with repeated impact over time.

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
